



The Ugly



- Software engineering shortfalls
 - Review process rushed
 - Not full test coverage
- Insufficient security model
 - No chroot/setuid
 - No ACL support



The Bad



- Missing Features
 - Data store update API
 - XFR (in & out)
 - Non-SQL data source
- Not optimized for performance



The Good

- Sá tibra
- Lots of DNS RFC goodness
 - 1034/1035, 2672 (DNAME), 3225 (DObit), 3658 (DS), 4033/4035/4036
 (DNSKEY, RRSIG, NSEC), 5155 (NSEC3)
- TDP/UDP, IPv4/IPv6
- SQL backend
- DNS library (C++, Python bindings)
- Automated build/test processes
